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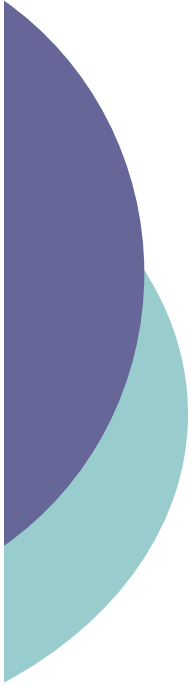

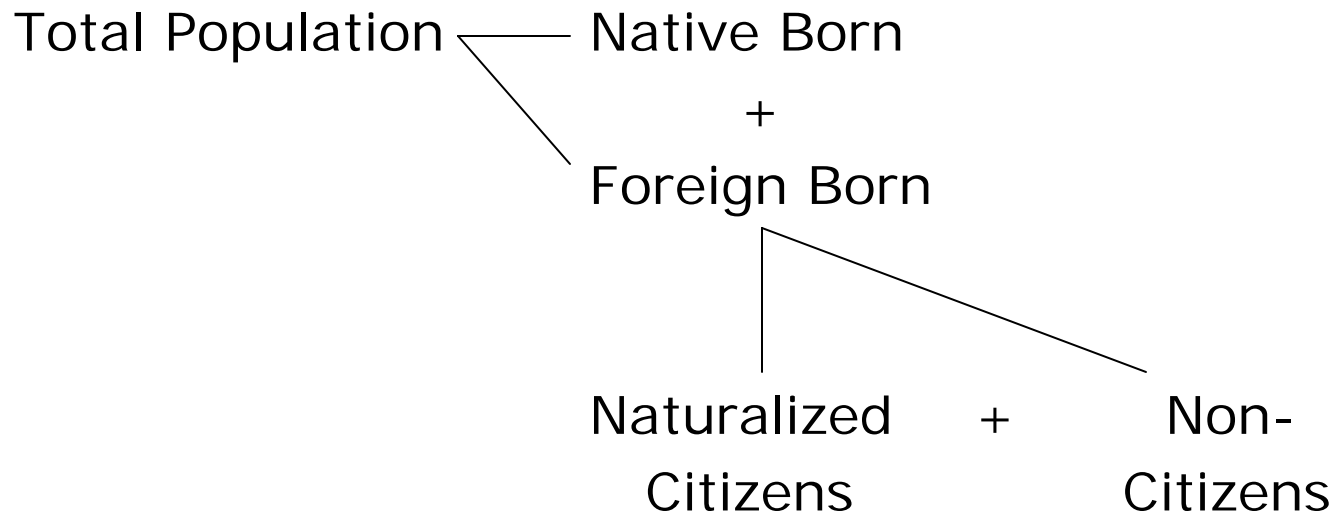

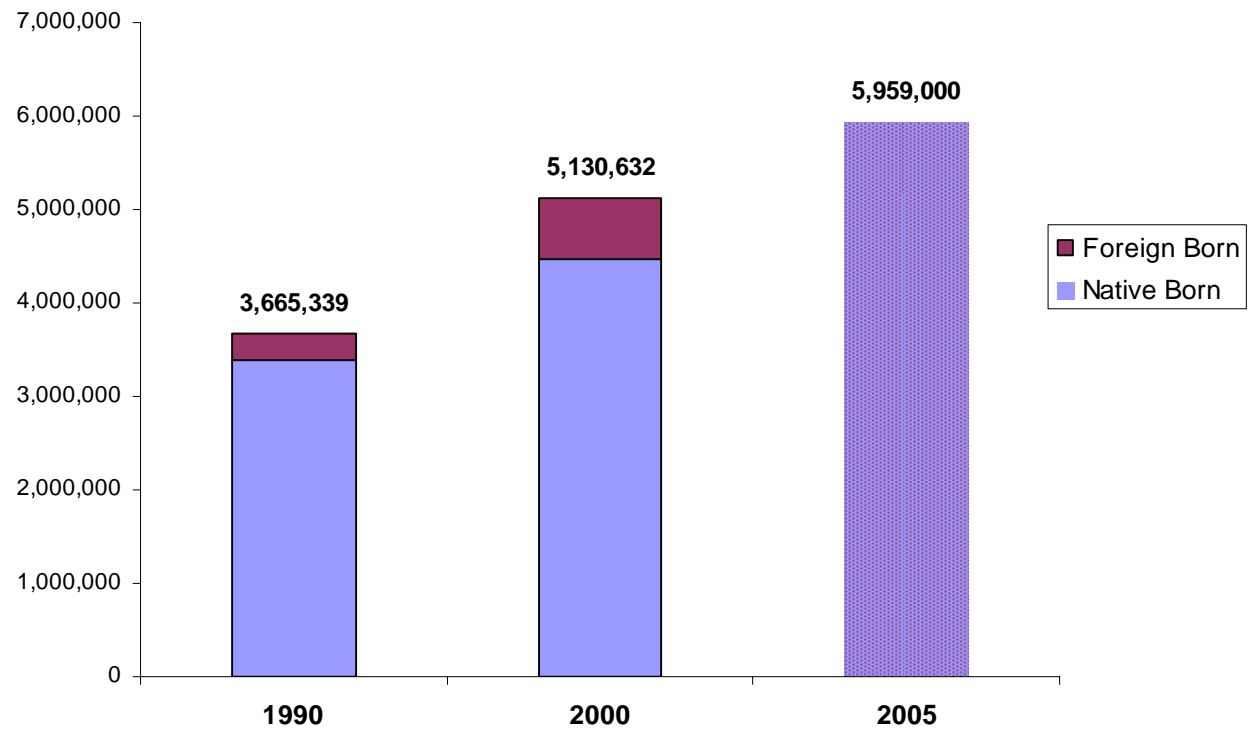
# Arizona's Immigrant Population Has Grown Significantly

Native Born: 32%

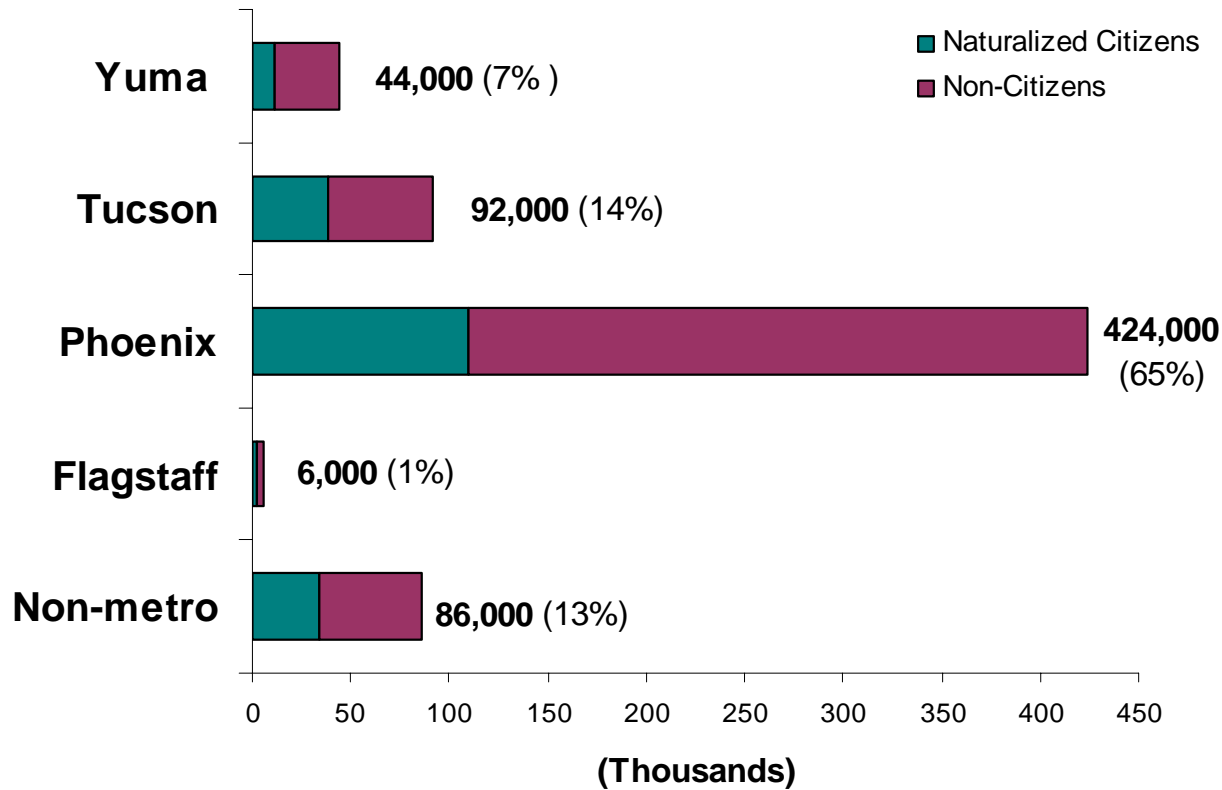
Foreign Born = 143%

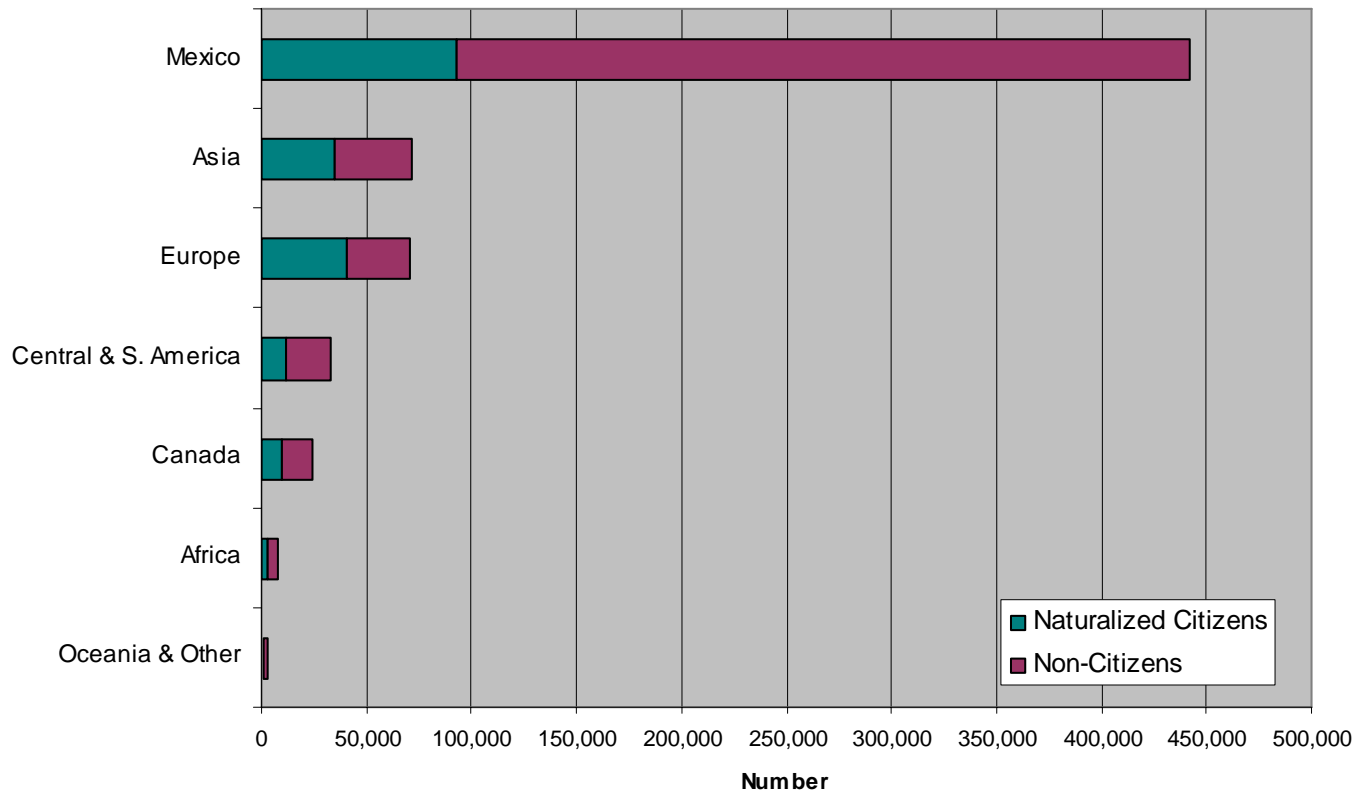
# Where Arizona's Foreign Born Live

Most foreign born live in Phoenix metropolitan area



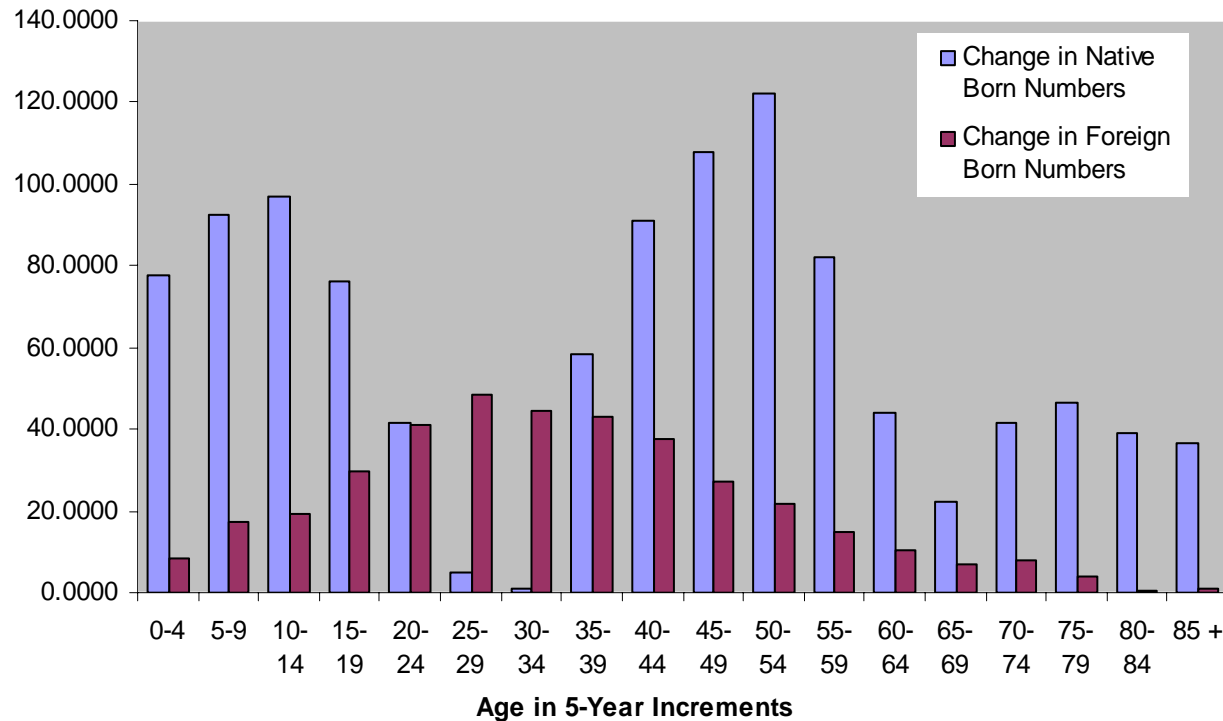
# Most Foreign Born Are From Mexico

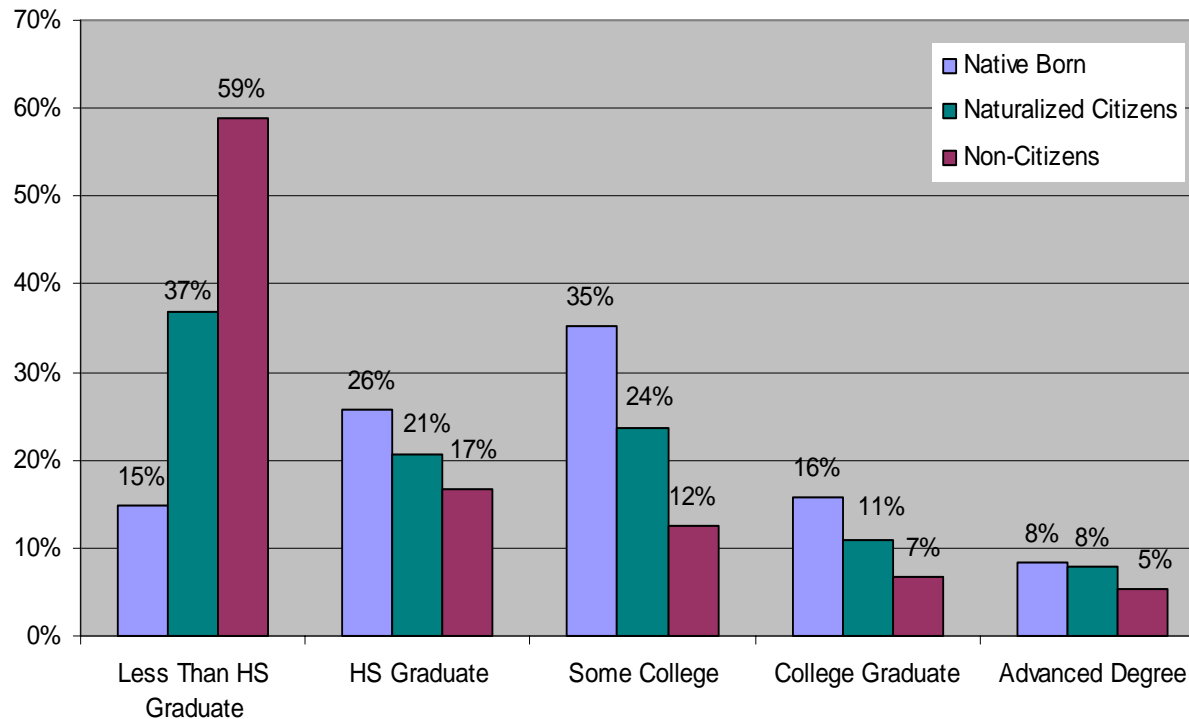
Are immigrant workers ***substitutes*** or ***complements*** of native-born workers?



# Native and Foreign-Born Differ in Educational Attainment

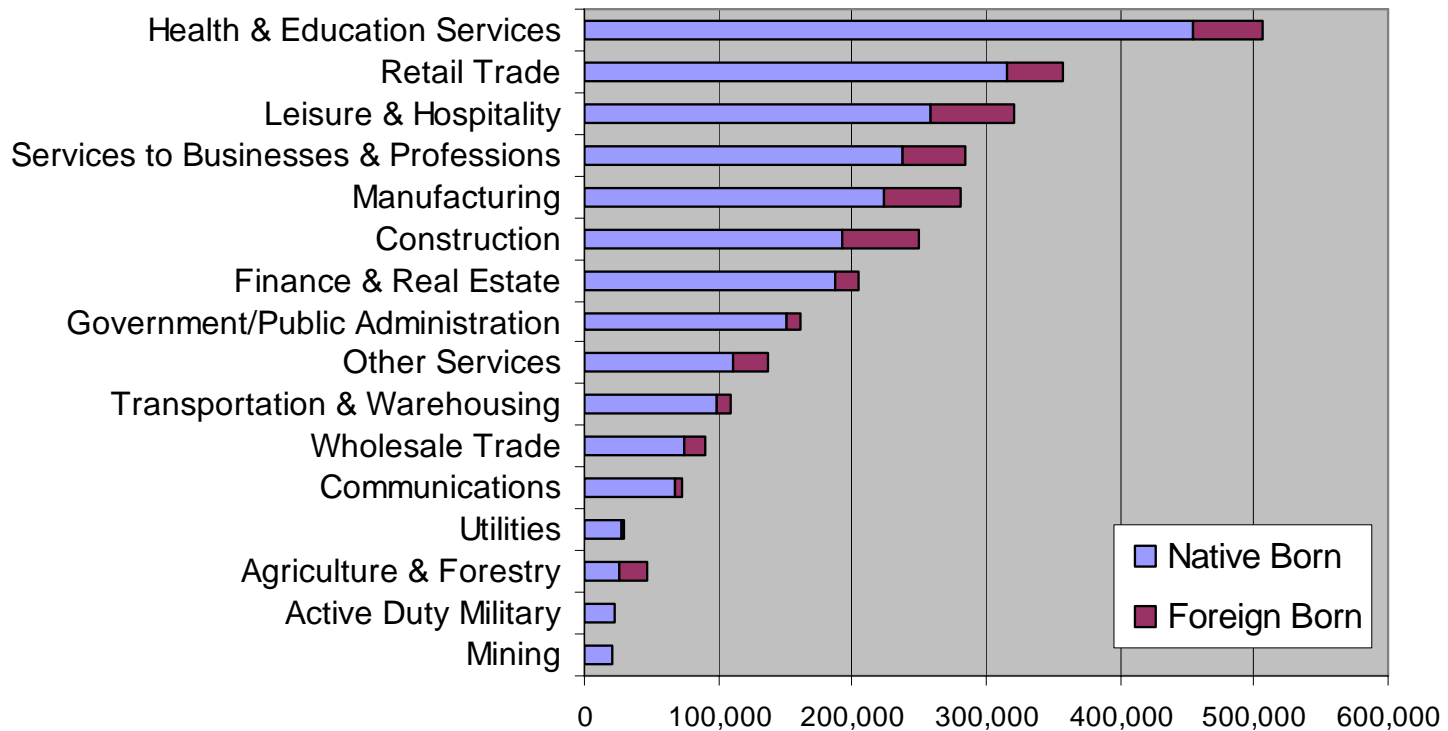
(Educational Attainment for Adults 25+ as of the 2000 Census)

41% of Arizona's non-citizens



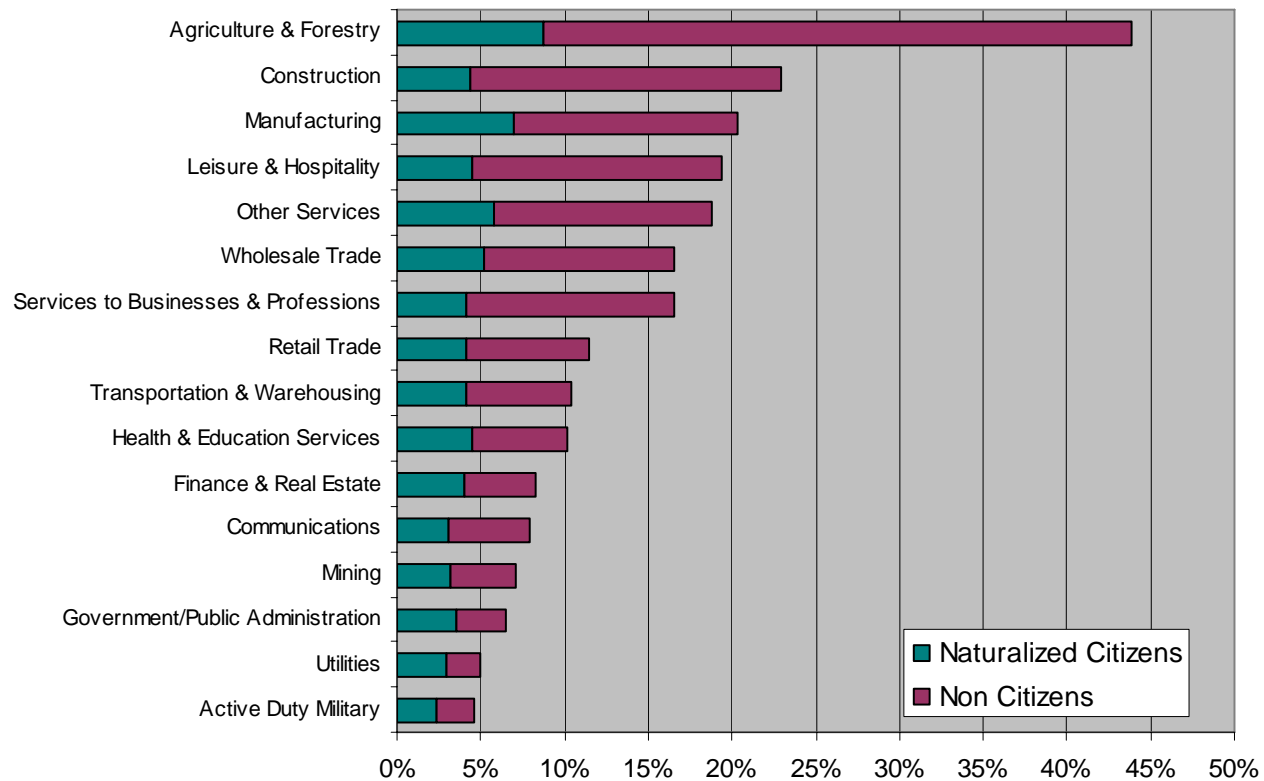
# Where Arizonans Work by Industry Group

Immigrants are 14.8% of Arizona's workforce



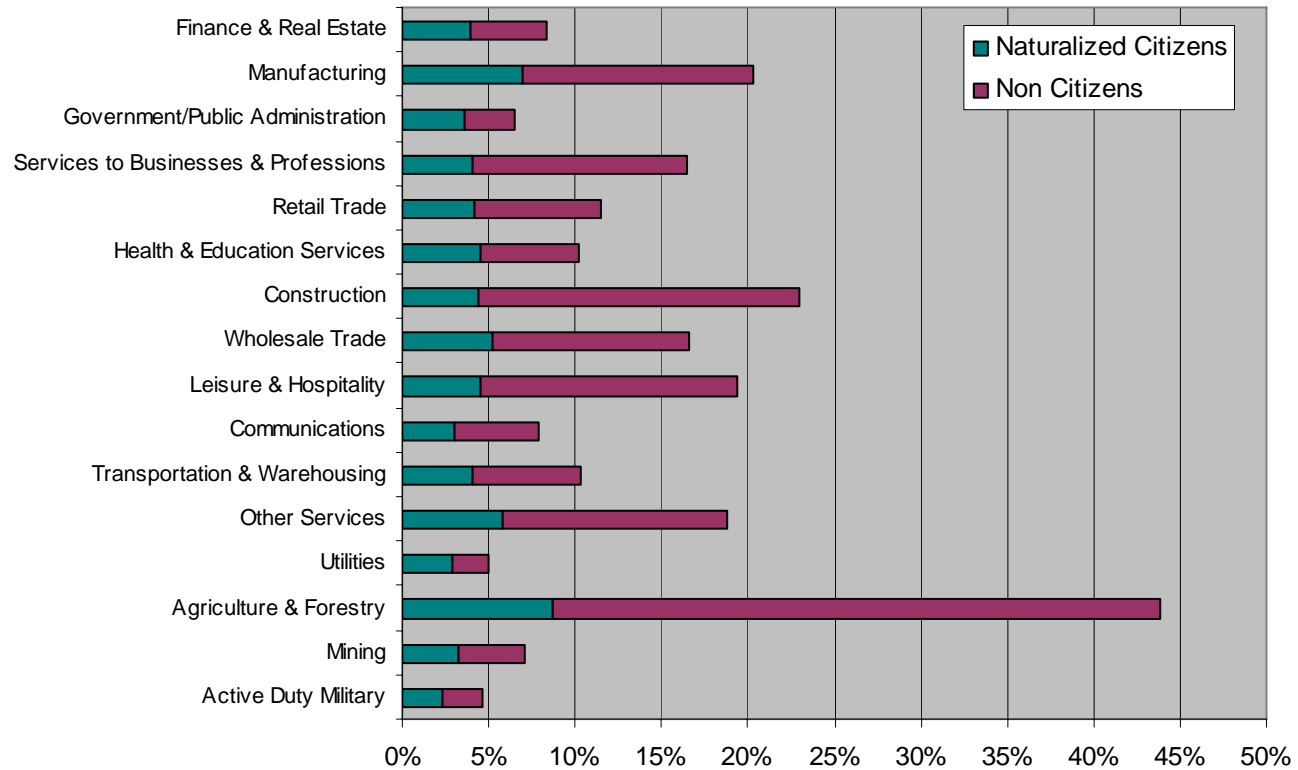
# Where Arizona's Foreign Born Work by Industry

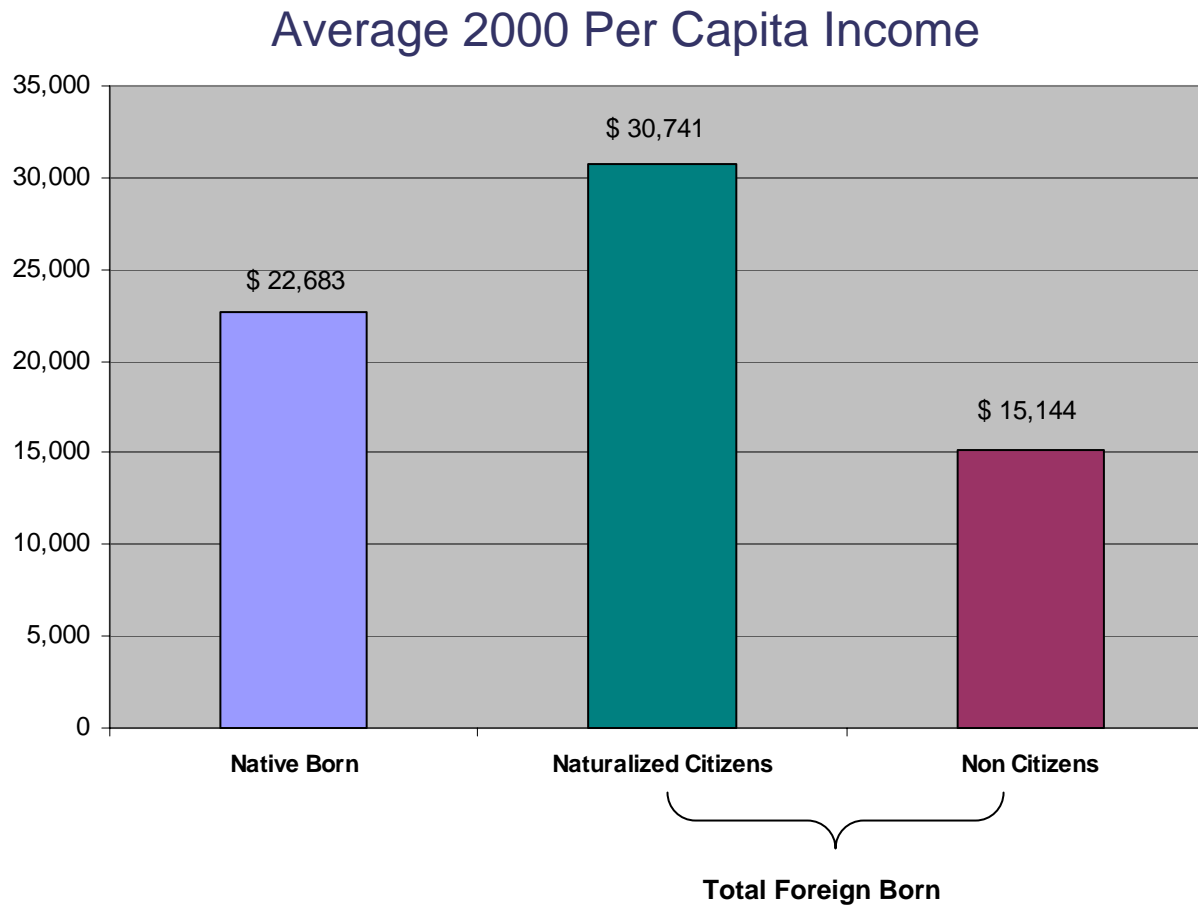

# Per Capita Income Drives Taxes

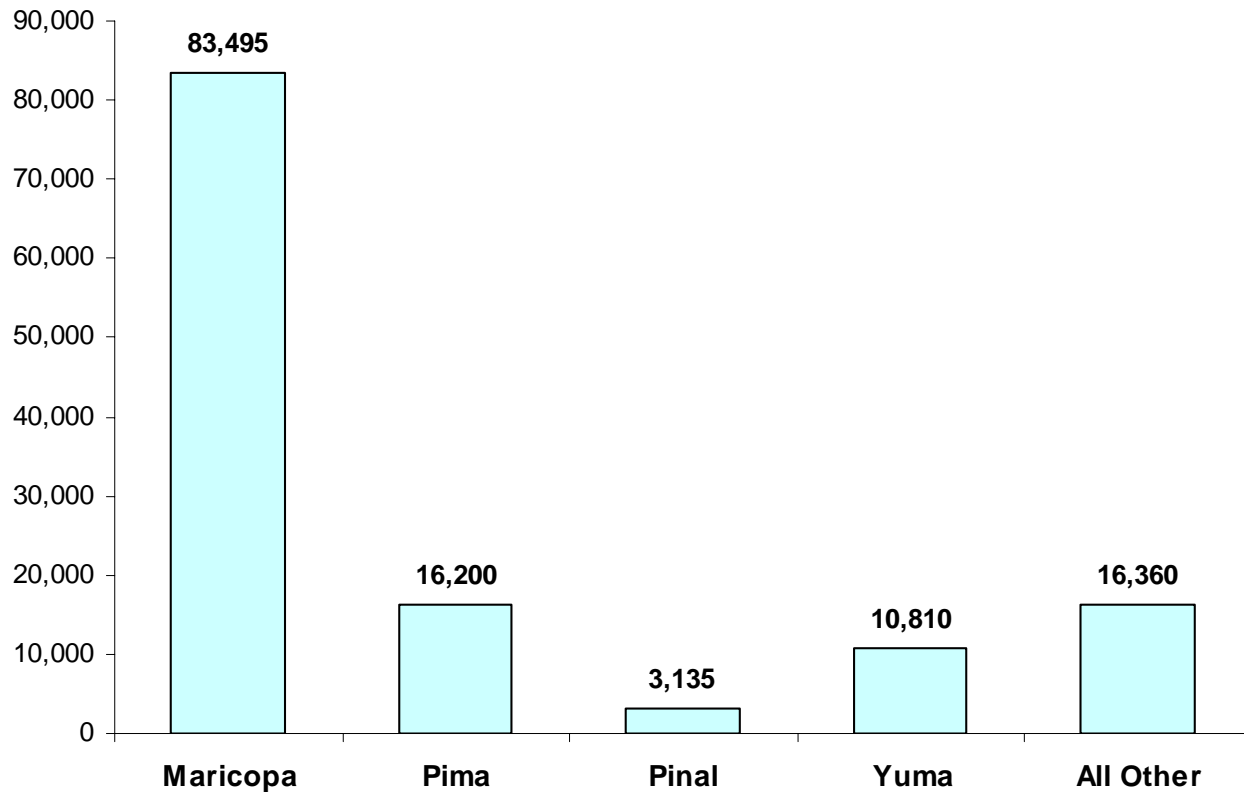

# 2005-2006 Estimated ELL Enrollment by County

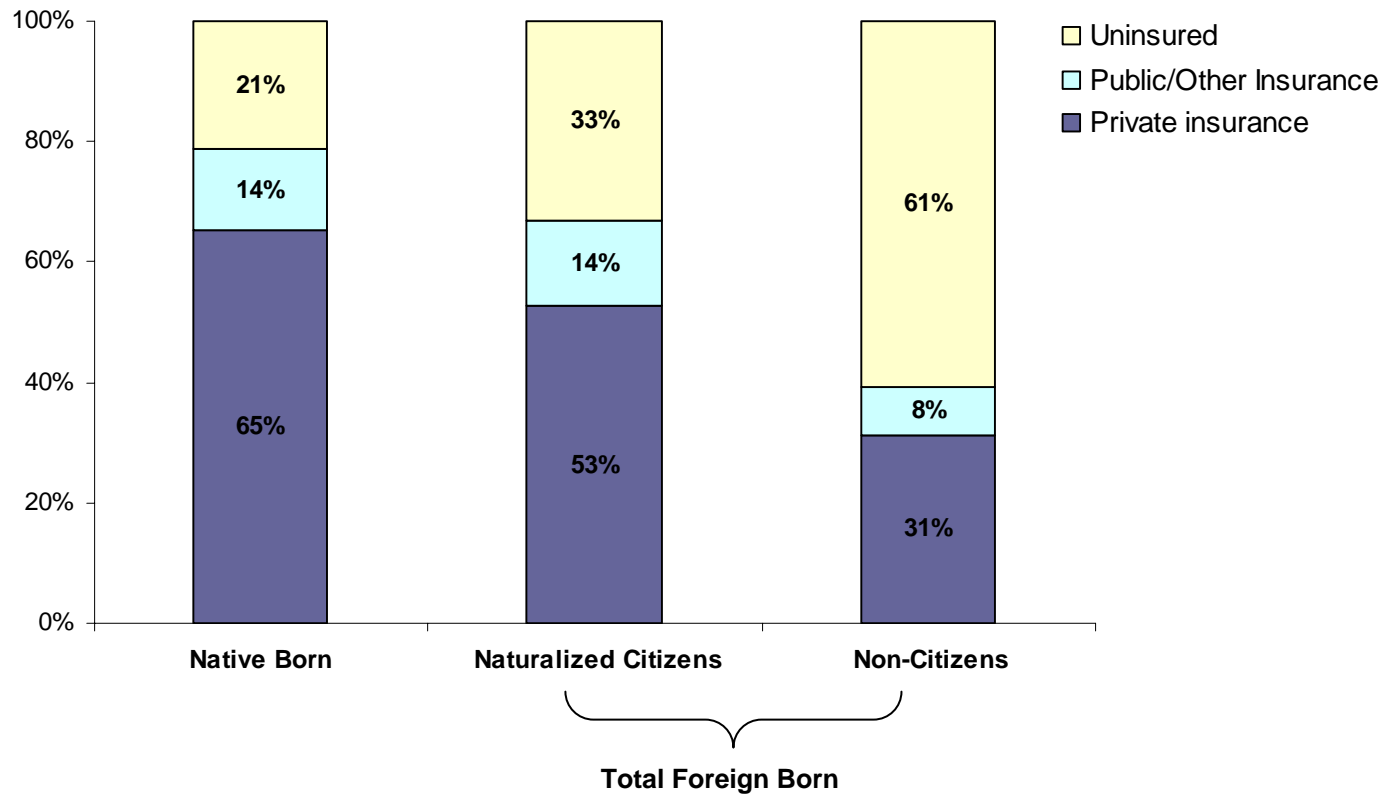

# Arizona Health Insurance Rates

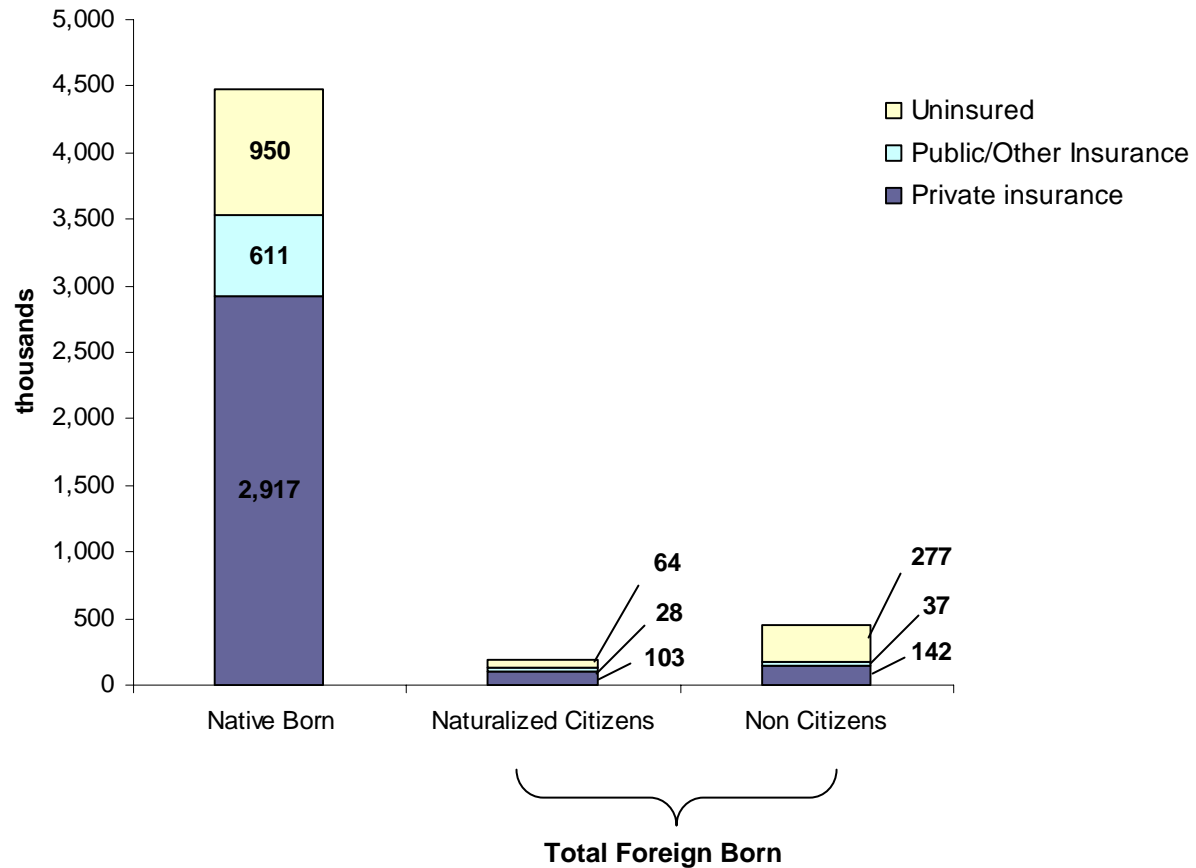
Foreign-born more likely to be uninsured
