## PUBLIC POLICY TRACK

ACADEMIC YEAR

The primary purpose of the fellowship is to support development of a research project with public policy relevance. Topics may span the range of public policy and need not relate to Udall Center activities. External support may consist of grants and/or fellowships from any external source (outside of the University of Arizona) that would provide resources to further the fellow's research agenda.

Proposals may be major, such as to NSF—or more modest, such as funding requests for visits to archives or other research sites. Over the course of the fellowship, fellows will work with Research Development Services at ORP to target, develop, and submit the proposal. By the end of the fellowship term, the Fellow will either have submitted a proposal or prepared a complete proposal draft (depending on submission due date).

## APPLICATION GUIDE

### Eligibility

This component of the competition will be open to tenured/tenure-track or continuing/continuing-eligible faculty members in any unit at the UA who will not be taking a sabbatical or other leave during the same academic year and who wish to carry out externally funded research on the public-policy dimensions of any subject or theme.

### Terms of the Fellowship

ORP and the Udall Center will provide the successful fellow's home department with funds to help replace the fellow's teaching responsibilities for one semester. We expect fellows to be fully released from teaching for the semester of their fellowship; the funds are made available to units as compensation for the release time and to cover related critical teaching needs. Fellowships will be awarded only if the applicant's home unit supports the application and the release of teaching time. Potential applicants must discuss the prospects of such support with department heads or directors prior to applying and should submit a signed form indicating departmental approval. The department head or director will be provided with an opportunity to endorse an application (or not) and to provide relevant comments (see below). Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee that will make recommendations to the Senior Vice President for Research and Partnership (at ORP) and the director of the Udall Center, who will inform applicants of awards following discussion with the units regarding funds and release time. Fellows are expected to present a colloquium on their work during the fellowship period and to acknowledge the institutional sources of support in grants, presentations, and publications resulting from the award.
